UPDATE SINCE LAST MEETING

- Third monitoring station installed at Young Offenders Center. Preliminary data available at meeting but not matched up against limits. Future reports will be formatted similar to existing reports.
- Design/cost estimate on proposed sound berm along west side of Stoney Trail operating area currently under development.
- Traffic study of pit entrance currently underway.
- Crusher at Stoney Trail shutting down. Will likely be January before another crusher moves into Stoney. Only plant running now is the asphalt plant. No night time operations for now. Asphalt plant only running during the day.
- Natural gas line installed to the SE property line at Stoney Trail. Final segment of the line will be installed over the winter once the asphalt plant is shut down and the area can be accessed.

GENERAL

- Discussion about asphalt plant. Plant is running on diesel fuel once again. It will remain so until the end of the year. Discussion about schedule. Shut down for this year is entirely dependant on weather. Temperatures hovering around zero not cold enough to stop paving operations on the ring road. Plant is running on a day to day basis and will cease operation when the weather turns cold. Plant components will likely remain on site throughout the winter. Paving will resume with the same plant next summer to complete work on the NWST ring road. Next years work is not anticipated to be much. Month or two worth of work if that. Plant will once again be running during the daytime and will be operating on diesel fuel.
- Discussion about asphalt plant configurations / equipment and what can be done (plant wise) to minimize emissions. Double drum plants produce the fewest emissions but all plants are governed by their Code of Practice through Alberta Environment. All plant must meet minimum standards. Discussion about the difficulties in setting higher standards for certain pits. Discussion about the difficulties in mandating that only certain plants designs can work in given locations. The commitment that all future contracts (road paving projects), will stipulate that natural gas be used as a burner fuel.
- Discussion about asphalt plant emissions.
- Discussion about information getting out to local residents. Some people are not getting any. Discussion about ways to improve the flow of information.

YOUNG OFFENDERS CENTER

- Still concerned with dust at facility for employees, offenders, and guests.
- Waiting for results of traffic study. YOC will monitor results from dust monitoring station as they come in.

ACTIONS

- AT to continue with traffic study.
 - BLV to make available the results on the recent stack testing on the asphalt plant.
 - BLV to continue design/cost estimate on noise berm.
 - BLV to look developing a 2008 newsletter to be distributed to local residents.
 - BLV to ensure that YOC is added to e-mailing system to ensure that they receive notification of any exceedance recorded by the dust monitors at the YOC.
 - Rocky Ridge Royal Oak Community Association to add link to the BLV website on their website to allow people better access to info available there. Website is: www.stoneytrailpit.ca
