UPDATE SINCE LAST MEETING

- New monitor arrived at Stoney Trail at the beginning of July. It has been set up in a location along the southern border of Stoney Trail. It was placed in that location to put it between the asphalt plant location and residents in Royal Oak. This monitor takes continuous readings. Those readings are then summarized in weekly and hourly averages which are compared to legislated requirements. Data will be collected weekly and posted on the Stoney Trail Website.
- Sweeping tractor is on site and sweeping debris from the entrance on a daily basis.
- Quotes have been received for a third monitoring station to be placed at the young offenders centre.

GENERAL

- Have received a couple of complaints over the past month related to noise. First one was related to rock trucks. They were having issues with loud exhaust systems and they have since been replaced. Second call was a local resident that took notice of the start up of the South Rock asphalt plant.
- No residents at this meeting – possibly a good sign that steps taken this year related to the asphalt plant have achieved a measure of success. Plant has been oriented to direct noise to the north, piles have been placed around the plant to help buffer noise, diesel fuel being burnt instead of recycled oil, running during the day instead of at night. Plant began operation on July 25th.
- Stack testing on the asphalt plant is scheduled for Aug 20th and Sept 9th.

YOUNG OFFENDERS CENTER

- Still concerned with dust at facility for employees, offenders, and guests.
- YOC has noticed improvement at entrance since arrival of sweeping tractor. BLV will continue to work with YOC to make the best use of this new equipment as possible.
- Discussion about debris on the road beyond the entrance and who is responsible for clean-up.
- Discussion about new Promet monitoring data and alarm levels.
- Discussion about the composition of dust escaping Stoney Trail and the possible health hazards it might pose. Emphasis on silica.
- Discussion about best way to test for composition of dust leaving Stoney Trail and what to look for as it relates to the health of people at the YOC.

ACTIONS

- Specs for third monitoring station to be finalized. [This was completed directly after the meeting and a third monitoring system has been ordered for placement at the Young Offenders Centre. Delivery expected to be approximately 6 weeks. BLV and YOC to review possible locations.](#)
- BLV to investigate alarm levels on 2nd monitoring station (didn't seem to be the same as the specs used by the first monitor).
- BLV to examine possibility of collecting dust sample from the monitoring stations and sending it for analysis related to the YOC concerns about the health affects of the dust.
- Lorne Milz to follow up with the City of Calgary about sweeping along 85th street.
- AIT to determine if it wants to post a communication on Stoney Trail webpage related to actions taken related to the South Rock asphalt plant (ie switching it to diesel).

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 11:00 AM.
