## **UPDATE SINCE LAST MEETING**

- Third monitoring station has arrived. A location was finalized in cooperation with the Young Offenders Center on October 10th. Installation will proceed as soon as some mounting brackets can be fabricated. This station will monitor dust directly at the YOC site.
- Calcium applied to high traffic areas in the pit in order to better control dust.

## **GENERAL**

- Have received an increase in complaints related to noise. Some related to crusher noise and some to the operation of the asphalt plant.
  - CRUSHERS – Met with local resident on October 2<sup>nd</sup> to review noise at night. (met at ~9:30pm). Noise was noticeable. Have also seen an increase in complaints over recent weeks. There was discussion about what could be done.
  - ASPHALT PLANT – Complaints about asphalt plant noise have also increased lately. There was discussion related to the plant schedule. The schedule is to continue operating as long as the weather holds (daytime operation only). There is also a portion of the NWST ring road which will likely need to be paved in 2009 as a few bridges behind schedule for completion. Until they are completed, the final paving work cannot proceed.

## **YOUNG OFFENDERS CENTER**

- Still concerned with dust at facility for employees, offenders, and guests.
- Discussion about chipped and broken windshields. Discussion about the impact of increased traffic at the Stoney Trail entrance. YOC again raising the desire to relocate the entrance to a different spot along 85<sup>th</sup> street as they believe it would have a positive affect on dust/rock chips/trafficability.

## **ACTIONS**

- BLV to ensure installation of third monitor takes place.
- AT to initiate a traffic study based on current traffic conditions and geometry at the entrance to Stoney Trail. Once completed, this should provide some guidance on the impact that Stoney Trail is having.
- BLV working with onsite crusher. Large pile directly east of the crusher is being depleted as quickly as possible. It has been suggested that this pile is reflecting

- noise back towards the west. Removing the pile will help determine the level of impact this might be having. As soon as is possible, the crusher will be moved to a location closer to the west mining face. By putting the crusher in this location, the mining face should provide a better barrier for sound escaping to the west.
- The possibility of building a sound berm along the west end of the active mining area was discussed. It is thought that a berm in this location would create a more affective barrier to sound. It would eliminate line of site issues for some residents whose homes are located at an elevation higher than the existing west berm. BLV to initiate planning on this item. A design will be created and a cost estimate developed.
